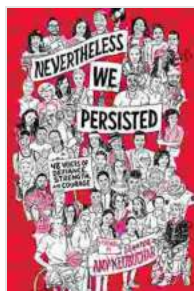

**Ancient Voices**

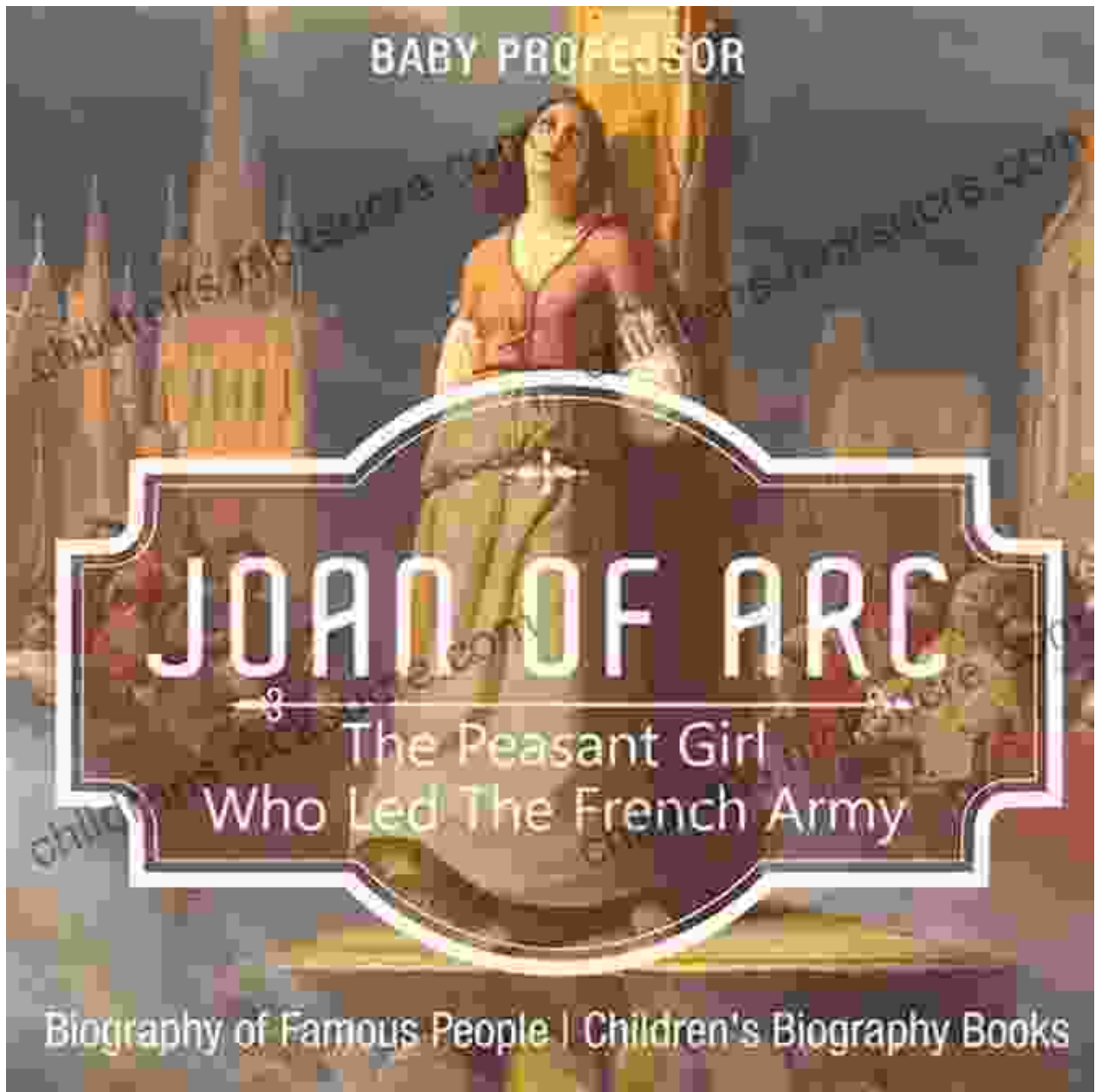




- **Boudicca:** The Celtic warrior queen who led a revolt against Roman rule in 60 CE, inspiring awe with her courage and determination.

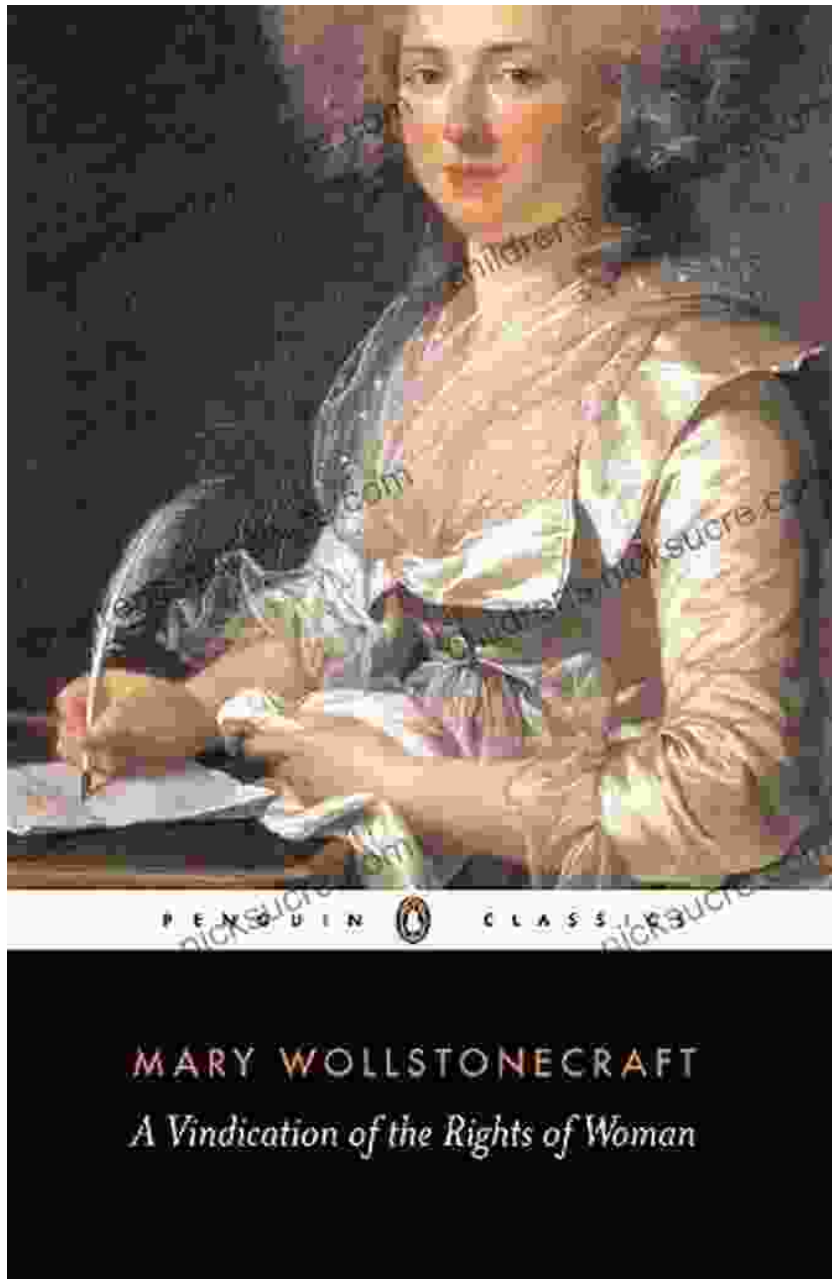
## **Renaissance and Enlightenment Voices**

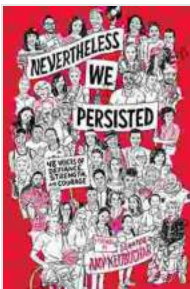
