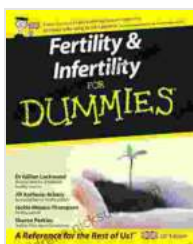

## Causes of Infertility

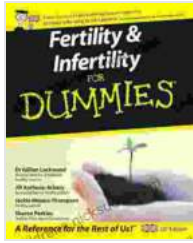

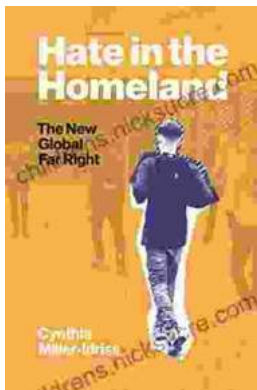
